Universal and General Precautions

Universal precautions is an approach to infectious disease control in which all human blood and body fluids are considered sources of contamination by bloodborne pathogens, especially the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Hepatitis B Virus (HBV). Universal precautions shall be observed throughout the District to protect employees, students and any other persons in the school environment from contact with potentially infectious blood or other body fluids.

General precautions are personal hygiene measures that reduce the spread of infectious diseases known to be transmitted by direct or indirect contact with a variety of body fluids such as saliva, urine, feces and nasal secretions.

Universal precautions together with general precautions are appropriate for preventing the spread of all infectious diseases and shall be used regardless of whether bloodborne pathogens are known to be present.
