Both schools applied for the Barona Education Grant earlier this school year. The process included securing the endorsement of a local legislator. El Modena American Literature teacher Carole Shelby submitted the application through State Senator Mimi Walters while Olive principal Kathryn Martin's application was approved by Assembly Member Curt Hagman.

Shelby will utilize the grant to purchase netbooks, a media cart, and a document camera along with an LCD projector for her classroom. "Technology helps engage students. This grant will help deliver the curriculum in a media that the students are comfortable with," said Shelby.

El Modena principal John Briquelet commended Shelby for pursuing the grant. "With current budget cuts and the challenge to keep up with technology, she is going above and beyond for her kids," he said.
