Protecting Student Athletes



William M. Habermehl Superintendent

In the 2008-2009 school year, four students in Orange County schools succumbed to cardiac-related deaths while playing organized sports. In the spring of 2008, Chip Prather, the Orange County Fire Authority Chief at the time, called me to have a discussion about the safety of our student athletes. He was interested in talking about three very important issues. First was the importance of proper hydration while engaging in sports activities, second was the school's use of the 911 system, and third was the availability and use of Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) in the schools.

Many partners, including doctors, school administrators, educators, parents, and first responders gathered to address the tragic student deaths and ways to prevent them. This group came to be known as

the Life-Threatening Events Associated with Pediatric Sports (LEAPS) collaborative. The group met regularly to discuss the concerns that Chief Prather had brought forward, hydration, emergency preparedness in the schools, and also raised the issue of screening student athletes who may be at high risk for sudden cardiac events.

One of the first outcomes of the LEAPS collaborative was the Hydrated and Healthy campaign which had its debut at Beckman High School in the Tustin Unified School District. The goal of this program is to educate the public about the importance of youth staying hydrated during physical activity, especially in warmer weather. The key message of the campaign

is that hydrating before, during, and after physical activity is essential to preventing heat-related illness.

The Orange County Fire Authority urged schools to call 911 immediately in case of a possible emergency rather than waste critical minutes trying to determine whether a student is in crisis or not. Educating all students and staff in CPR was another recommendation of the collaborative. In addition, the group encouraged schools to consider the use of AEDs. An AED is a simple, voice-automated machine that, when attached to the chest of a victim, will introduce a mild electronic shock to bring the heart back into life-saving rhythm. Currently there are 10 school districts in Orange County that have implemented AED programs and have the devices available for use at school sites and at athletic events.

Determining which student athletes might be at risk for cardiac events is an important piece of the puzzle in keeping our students safe. The use of Electrocardiograms (EKGs) as part of the pre-participation athletic physical can be used to determine if a student has a congenital heart condition that may put them at high-risk for a sudden cardiac event. A pilot program is ongoing at one of our local high schools, offering EKGs to the student athletes.

It has been great to see how physicians, educators, school board members, and other community representatives have joined together to face the serious issue of life threatening events of student athletes. This work will change the way our communities support our athletes and enable us to continue to provide a world class education where every student succeeds.
