## Richland High School Returns 58 Students to their Home School

ORANGE, Calif., February 8, 2011—The Orange Unified School District is pleased to announce that last week Richland High School returned 58 students to their home school after they recovered missing credits. Students entering Richland have the opportunity to recover missing credits and either return to their home school or graduate early once they have completed all requirements.

Each student entering Richland is given an Academic Plan to follow. They agree to complete the courses listed and once completed they are eligible to return to their home school or remain at Richland to graduate. These 58 students completed all classes necessary to make the transfer possible. Counselors from the four high schools met with the Richland students prior to their transfer back to insure a smooth transition.

Eleven students elected to remain at Richland and graduated early.
