Cyberbullying and Social Media

Sometimes, there are people who feel strongly about a post and say rude things. Some people choose to post bad things to brag, to humiliate others, or to gain attention. Unfortunately, some people choose not to do this. If they say rude things about others, this can easily become cyberbullying. Many kids are hurt by this. Some forms are threats, impersonations, and harassments. Ernie Allen, CEO of National Center for Missing and Exploited Children says, "Kids are going to post photos and personal information. At least they should be aware of the risks. And at least Moms and Dads should know what they are doing."

Viruses and Scams

Some people create a copy of real websites in order to hack into people's email accounts. This is called phishing. If you fall for these and click on it, you will have to enter personal information. The person will then keep that information and use it to hack into your email and all of your accounts that use those same usernames and passwords. These websites can also infect your computer with a virus. You can get these viruses also from internet downloads, CD and file shares, and lots of other non-secure websites. You can prevent these by installing antivirus software.

Addiction

When people get a handheld device like a tablet or a phone, they might become addicted to it. This may be dangerous because the addiction takes away from the person's focus on what is going on around them. These addictions can be bad for your eyes and it can take away from learning and other social activities when you may be wasting time on your device. Addiction to devices can also be very dangerous when driving. You've probably heard of texting while driving. This is bad for many reasons. You can increase the risk of having an accident like colliding with another car or driving over a person. Also, a device can be distracting in places like a busy city, or a store.

"Thank you," said Jaws. And he was never hungry again.


The Man that Ate Only Green By Ty Mittelstaedt (Gr. 3)




"You can wish to share your power," says Shadow. So she does.
