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Greetings from Alternative Education!

Alternative Education is comprised of five programs: Community Day School; Independent Study; Home/Hospital; Adult Transition; and Adult Education. Each program is a highly specialized and is unique to the individual needs of the students.

Community Day School (CDS) serves students in seventh through 12th grades. This program is built on the belief that all students can learn when given the appropriate environment, educational expertise, and opportunity.

Alternative Education is also proud to have an Independent Study High School/Home School K–8 program serving students

in kindergarten through 12th grade. This program combines the benefits of home school with face-to-face instruction from highly qualified Orange Unified School District teachers. Students with special needs may also participate in this program.

From time to time, students become ill and cannot attend school due to medical reasons. For those students, we have Home/Hospital. The purpose of this program is to help students maintain continuity of instruction during a period of temporary disability.

The Adult Transition program serves adult students with Individualized Educational Plans. The program goal is to meet the needs of 18 to 22-year-old young adults with developmental disabilities. Our key focus is to help young adults build independence and quality of life by linking adult students with appropriate community and adult services.

Adult education is a public education program for all adults ages 18 and older. Students can earn high school diplomas through this program. Classes are offered in the evenings and are flexible to meet the individual needs and fit the schedules of the students.
