SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Orange High School has served the community of Orange for 111 years. Strong support from the local community has made it a unique community -based school steeped in long-standing traditions and pride. A great number of the students here are second and third generation Panthers.

We provide a rigorous curriculum for all students; promote a learning environment that supports high achievement and celebrates success; and encourage accountability of all student learning.

Our school reflects a culture of students with character, a climate of safety and tolerance, and an organization that values each member as a contributing factor to our school's success.

SUPPORT & GUIDANCE

- OHS has four counselors, a P21 Instructional Specialist, a Title 1 Advisor, an English Learner Advisor, an Academic Language Mentor, two Instructional Coaches, a College Readiness Advisor, and a Career Readiness Advisor.
- OHS prepares students to take state and national tests including: the PSAT, SAT, ACT, and ASVAB.
- Support and guidance staff works to create individual 4 year plans for each student.
- OHS has various intervention and support networks to assist students and families if any issues arise.


