

Information on AB1575

On September 29, 2012, the governor signed AB 1575, a bill that codifies the State Constitutional ban on pupil fees and details. Existing law requires the Legislature to provide for a system by which a public school is required to be supported by a district. Existing law prohibits a pupil enrolled in public school from being required to pay a fee, deposit, or other charge not specifically authorized by law. This bill would prohibit a pupil enrolled in a public school from being required to pay a pupil fee, as defined, for participation in an educational activity. The bill would provide that this prohibition is not to be interpreted to prohibit solicitation of voluntary donations, voluntary participation in fundraising activities, or school districts, schools, and other entities from providing pupils prizes or other recognition for voluntarily participating in fundraising activities. The bill would specify that these provisions apply to all public schools, including, but not limited to, charter schools and alternative schools, are declarative of existing law, and should not be interpreted to prohibit the imposition of a fee, deposit, or other charge otherwise allowed by law.

Information on GATE: Gifted and Talented Education

The Office of Curriculum and Instruction is currently beginning the GATE screening and identification process for the 2014-2015 school year. This school year OUSD will facilitate universal screening of all 3rd grade students for the GATE Program. Parents who do not want their child tested may fill out an option out form, which can be obtained from the classroom teacher or the GATE office. Students in second grade and 4th-6th grade may be referred for GATE testing by parents, teachers, or administrators. Screening will begin on January 26^o 2015 through March 6, 2015. Identification results will be mailed home by mid-April, 2015.

Identification for GATE involves a review of multiple criteria including

- SAI score on the district selected cognitive abilities test
- Student achievement records
- Lexile score
- Student Profile of Gifted Characteristics

Parents have the option for students that qualify for GATE Identification to have them attend the assigned GATE magnet school or to remain at their home schools. Please note that students qualifying in grades 5 and 6 are often waitlisted due to lack of space at the elementary level but are then eligible for preferred enrollment for Honors courses at the middle school level.

If a parent wishes to refer a student for consideration, please submit a Referral form online, which can be found on the OUSD GATE website, www.orangeusd.org/gate or contact the GATE office at 714-628-5451.

All parent referrals must be submitted to the GATE office no later than December 5, 2014.
